## The Staff of Life. Aerial Photographs by Georg Gerster

Georg Gerster (born 1928 in Winterthur) started out on his first photography flight in 1963, in Sudan. Since then he has not only travelled all the world's continents, but also succeeded in raising the traditional plane shot to the status of an aerial image. Today Gerster is regarded as an international pioneer of aerial photography. For decades, his images shaped the visual identity of Swissair and his publications have drawn millions of readers. "I see my best aerial photographs as a jump-start for flights of the imagination. The aerial image is a tool of reflection: from a height you see not only what is there, but also what might be – an inventory of our possibilities."

The exhibition at the Fotostiftung Schweiz is showing 50 highlights from a 50-year career. It revolves around that burning issue of available resources: in the face of a world population of more than 7 million people, food is destined to be a key question in the years to come. Already global food production resembles an ominous agricultural monopoly: a small number of large producers, international concerns and globally-operating investment funds are securing huge amounts of territory so as to gain maximum yields from the earth. There is less and less space for small-holder production models.

From this point of view, Georg Gerster's images also have an eminently political component – albeit without putting forward any bold and simple accusations or answers. As the photographer himself writes: "Land use reflects more than just constraints of a pedological, operational, legal, topographical or macroeconomic nature, land use also reveals something about mind-sets and psychological states." Anyone who delves into Gerster's work may, by all means, allow themselves to be seduced by the beauty of the surfaces, may indulge in the aesthetic of the images – and thus recognise what is at stake.

Born 30 April 1928 in Winterthur. Studied German and English at Zurich University, where he received his doctorate. 1950-56 science editor with the *Weltwoche*, Zurich. Since 1956 free-lance publicist with science reportage and aerial photography as his special areas. Extended travels throughout the world, including the Antarctic. For three decades aerial photographs by Gerster on Swissair posters and wall calendars shaped the visual identity of the airline. Gerster has made regular contributions to the *Neue Zürcher Zeitung* and the *National Geographic Magazine*.
